What was the day of Pentecost and upon what day of the week did it fall? Verse 1.
2. How does the grammatical construction of Acts 1:26 and Acts 2:1 point only to the twelve as those baptized in the Holy Spirit? Verse 1.
3. Does "it" that "filled all the house where they were sitting" refer to the sound, the wind, or the Holy Spirit? Verse 2.
4. Describe the <i>visible</i> sign that accompanied the <i>audible</i> sign that was like a rushing, mighty wind. Verse 3.
5. What statement of Jesus in Acts chapter 1 was fulfilled on this day? Verse 4.
6. What was the evidence that the apostles were filled with the Holy Spirit? Verse 4.

7. What kind of Jews were at Jerusalem and what called them to the temple to hear Peter's words? Verses 5-6.
8. What is the third miracle here besides the sound and the tongues like fire? Verse 6.
9. Why were the hearers amazed when the apostles, all Galileans, were able to do what they did? Verse 7.
10. Was this a miracle by those who had the baptism of the Holy Spirit (the apostles) or those who did not have the Holy Spirit (the hearers)? In other words, was this a miracle of hearing or speaking? Verse 8.

13. What do you think would be included in "the wonderful works of God"? Verse 11.

16. Why was Peter the speaker at this time? Verse 14.
