1. What was a steward and what was his duty for the rich man? Verse 1.
2. What punishment did the steward receive? Verse 2.
3. Why couldn't the former steward support himself with the two options he thought were available? Verse 3.
4. Did the steward leave out any of his lord's debtors? Verses 4-5.
5. How did the steward propose to make his lord's debtors obligated to him? Verses 6-7.
6. Was what the steward did honest? If not, how was the steward an example to "the children of light"? Verse 8.

7. How can Jesus' disciples make friends of unrighteous mammon? Verse 9.

8. Does God judge us by the amount entrusted to us or our use of it? Verse 10.

9. What is unrighteous mammon and what are the true riches? Verse 11.

10. Since we are only stewards of earthly riches, what is that which is our "own"? Verse 12.

11. Why is it that a servant cannot serve two masters? Verse 13.

12. Why did Jesus point out to the Pharisees that God knows men's hearts? Verses 14-15.

13. Since John, all are trying to force the kingdom into existence, but has the law failed? Verses 16-17.

14. What rule of God violated by the Pharisees is cited by Jesus to illustrate the statement in the previous verse? Verse 18.

15. There are several contrasts between Lazarus and the rich man. Can you name three? Verses 19-20.

16. One of these men evidently had a funeral. Which one? Verse 22.

17. What do you think it means to be in "Abraham's bosom"? Verse 23.

18. A drop of water may seem small but what small thing was denied to Lazarus by the rich man? Verse 24.

19. What principle set forth in verse 9 did the rich man neglect? Verse 25.

20. What conclusions can be reached from the fact that a great gulf is fixed and that the rich man saw Lazarus “afar off” (verse 23)? Verse 26.

21. How do these verses teach that this scene was after death, yet before the judgment? Verses 27-28.

22. How could they hear Moses and the prophets? Were they still living? Verse 29.

23. What did the rich man think would cause his brethren to repent? Do you think it would be effective? If not, why not? Verse 30.

24. Would anything besides the Bible be sent to convince them to repent? Verse 31.
