

Questions on Luke chapter 17

1. Can you see a relation to the rich man's fate in the previous chapter to the fate of one who leads others into sin? Verses 1-2.
2. Some say that Jesus warned the disciples of four sins in the first ten verses of this chapter. What sin is addressed here? Verses 3-4.
3. The sin in these verses has to do with a lack of what? Verses 5-6.
4. Is it possible for a servant to do more than his duty? Verses 7-9.
5. Is it wrong to think we can earn salvation? Verse 10.
6. What were lepers and why did they stand "afar off"? Verses 11-12.

7. What did the lepers mean by “have mercy,” and when was their request answered? Verses 13-14.

8. Why is it stressed that the man glorified God with a “loud” voice? Verses 15-16.

9. Why did Jesus refer to the man as a stranger? Verses 17-19.

10. What kind of kingdom did the Pharisees expect and what kind did Jesus describe? Verses 20-21.

11. Jesus predicted that the upcoming persecution would cause the disciples to do what? Verse 22.

12. How will the disciples know the difference if false prophets predict the Savior’s return? Verses 23-24.

13. Did Jesus predict His coming in His kingdom soon, that is, in His generation? Verse 25.

14. How will the coming of the Son of man be like the days of Noah? Verses 26-27.

15. Were there signs that indicated destruction in the days of Lot? Verse 28.

16. What destroyed the cities of Sodom and Gomorrah? Verse 29.

17. In both Noah's and Lot's day, people were saved out of the destruction. How will that be like the coming of Christ? Verse 30.

18. How does Jesus teach the folly of being concerned about material things at His coming? Verse 31.

19. What was the mistake of Lot's wife that Jesus warns about? Verse 32.

20. What will happen in that day if our hopes are centered upon material things only? Verse 33.

21. How can it be both night and day at the coming of Christ? Verse 34.

22. Which ones will be saved, and which ones will be lost? Verses 34-36.

23. In what way does sin and wrongdoing bring punishment? Verse 37.

24. What two tremendous events recorded in the Old Testament does Jesus endorse in this chapter as real history?
